A Note on School Tuition from your Business Manager:

Hello parish and school family. I would like to share my thoughts on the recent changes in our school tuition. Please know that I value all people and have a special affinity for those in our more immediate parish and school family. I appreciate the very generous people who, while having varying interests in our endeavors here, consistently demonstrate great support in their contributions of time, talent and treasure. Thank you. To the extent that I have some influence on decisions made I want to be clear that the main filter used is the simple question, "By doing this, are we being good stewards of the resources entrusted to us?"

Since I started here in July of 2020, I have been overwhelmed with the generosity and kindness of the people in our community. The school funding apparatus was understood to include a subsidy at the end of the fiscal year from our reserves to the school operating loss. Yes, that is correct. We expected the school to lose money but value its impact so greatly that the subsidy has been justified. Keep in mind, these "reserves" are also coming from you (parishioners and school families) in the various ways you contribute to the parish as a whole.

Last Fall, after we had already published tuition rates, Ohio implemented, effective immediately, an expansion of the EdChoice Scholarship program to cover some or even all of the tuition costs (depending on family income reported—as a manner of assessing need). While the scholarships are granted to the family (to avoid concerns that opposition to the program would regard it as a violation of the constitution's separation of church and state), the school where the student is attending is still expected to cooperate in the administrative implementation of the scholarship, receiving the check from the state and depositing it once it is signed over by the family. In no case will the check be able to be used for anything but tuition at the school chosen.

Due to this great opportunity to make our school solvent on its own with a tuition rate that covers the bulk of costs, we made an abrupt change to the already published tuition rates increasing the amount to be more in line with our actual cost per student. Recognizing the adverse impact this could have on family budgets that have planned for the previous tuition amount and may not qualify for enough EdChoice money to cover the increase in tuition, we opted to justify the use of anticipated new revenue to cover the difference of what any family budget was to experience in an unanticipated increase.

Regardless of a families financial situation, it was incumbent upon us to implement this new payment methodology immediately. Consistency in implementation is necessary so there has been some confusion and concern about the impact on personal family budgets this year and going forward. Please stay tuned for next year's rates (tied to our costs again) and scholarships available.

Matt Daniels and Jake Johnson from the Diocese will be at the school on <u>Thursday, February 1st at 5:30 pm</u> to present info on EdChoice and also their new Scholarship Granting Organization status which will allow for a tax credit to help offset additional tuition costs.


