Old Rusiness

- Parish House/Kirby: The house is empty, and the locks have been changed. What happens with the house is now up to Fr.
 Savio. The council is unsure if a motion and approval from us is needed. This was tabled until February.
- Kirby/Upper cemetery Plot App: Aaron was not present. Tabled until February.
 - Tom asked if there was a financial report for the cemeteries. The council viewed a brief financial report that was included in the 2023 annual report.
 - Tom also inquired about the Somonis Endowment that is to be directed to the Salem Heritage organization.
 Deacon Kevin stated that Allen Young is currently looking into this.
- Parish Sign: The sign is made, except for the weatherproof casing. It is due to be installed on 1/19/24, weather permitting.
- Solar Eclipse: Council members have heard advertising from the Bucyrus area for camping sites. The K of C have declined
 participating in any fundraising meals, as well as the parish. Kirby parishioners are unsure.
 - Council members have asked how the parish grounds in Kirby will be protected from campers. Taping off the area was discussed. It was recommended that Doug Synder be involved in the process of securing the property.
- Fr. Max Koble: Fr. Conrad is still working with this project. We believe the date has been set for April 21th, at St. Peter's gym.
- Religious Ed. Coordinator/youth minister: There have been four parishioners that have voiced interest in these positions.
 Most have said they are interested in one, but not both. No decisions will be made until Fr. Savio returns.

New Business:

- Food pantry community meal: Joanna Gilmore was present. She runs the Christian Food Center.
 - o Recently there was an Ecumenical meeting of local parishes. They would like each parish to take a turn hosting a community meal at St. Paul on the 3rd Saturday of the month, from 10 am to 12 noon. This coincides with when the food pantry is open. The hope is that those that need the pantry services will stop in for a meal and vice versa. The meal is open to the public.
 - These meals used to be held in the evening at various churches. Now they will be held at one church, St. Paul, and hosted by local churches.
 - This Saturday, 1/20, will be the first meal. We will know more about how many to expect and how many workers will be needed after this and the next couple of months' meals.
 - The request is for a brunch style meal. Each parish will provide the food and drinks, prepare it, serve it, and clean up after. Each parish will also provide table service.
 - Five local churches/parishes were at the meeting and signed up. Hopefully more will volunteer in the future. Each
 parish may only need to provide this service once or twice a year.
 - Transfiguration parish has tentatively been signed up for the month of May.
 - Beth Collins, from St. Paul, is the contact person.
 - It was suggested that each parish contribute money to a "kitty" for coffee and possibly table service.
 - Flyers were requested to put in the bulletin.

Items not on the agenda:

- Server training will be held in the next two weeks at Upper and at Kirby. The suggested kneelers for the servers have been
 donated to the church and chapel. Servers will be made aware of them at the training.
- Fr. Savio will be returning on 2/5/24. He is currently looking for bells for the servers and other items for the church while in India.
- We decided to start providing Bio's of the Pastoral Council members to put in the bulletin. Joan was nominated to start this.
 They are to be sent to the secretary before Tuesday at noon to make the bulletin deadline. Please provide a picture as well.
- Mary Ann our secretary is retiring in March. Her position has been posted in the bulletin.


