



LOGSDON SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Logsdon Scholarship Fund, created by the late Giles and Carol Logsdon, will take applications March 15, 2025 through April 30, 2025. Natives of Wyandot County, the Logsdons lived down the road from where Giles was born, and farmed both theirs and part of the original family farm while operating several businesses over the years. These included a wood burning stove store, first operated out of the former Harpster General Store and then from their home, an embroidery business, an orchard, and a Christmas tree farm. Carol likewise was a lifelong farmer who grew up in Eden Township.

Giles and Carol Logsdon established The Logsdon Scholarship Fund to provide scholarships annually to qualified students who have accomplished all of the following:

- 1. Have attended St Peter Catholic School in Upper Sandusky, Ohio;
- 2. Have graduated from High School; and
- 3. Have attended an accredited post-secondary educational institution, either academic or vocational (trade school); completing at least one year of a two or more year course of study.

Saint Patrick - March 17th

At 16, St. Patrick was captured by Irish raiders and sold as a slave in Ireland. After 6 years, he escaped and went on to become a bishop. He began having dreams and visions about the people in Ireland ultimately leading him to do mission work there. He went where the faith had never been preached, obtained protection of the local kings, made numerous converts, ordained many priests, divided the country into dioceses, held Church councils, founded several monasteries and continually urged his people to greater holiness in Christ. He suffered much oppression, but within a short time the island felt the Christian spirit and prepared to send out missionaries to Christianize Europe. Because of St. Patrick going back to the place where he was enslaved, Ireland and much of Europe heard the Gospel of Jesus Christ! Happy St. Patrick's Day!


